

Public Works for Water and Power Development and Energy Research Appropriation Bill, 1976: Testimony of Members of Congress and other interested individuals and organizations, , ; United States. Congress. House. Committee on Appropriations. Subcommittee on Public Works

The Energy and Water Development appropriations bill includes funding for civil works projects of the Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Reclamation (BOR), the Department of Energy (DOE), and a number of independent agencies. Key budgetary issues involving these programs include. The House Appropriations Committee reported out its FY2008 Energy and Water Development Appropriations bill, H.R. 2641 (H.Rept. 110-185), on June 6, 2007. The bill as reported did not contain indications of funding for specific projects. "Subtitle H" Research, Development, Demonstration, and Information "Sec. 8001. Development and atomic energy commission appropriation bill, 1975. HEARINGS. But from the very beginning of the nuclear power program there has been strong opposition in the Navy. Were it not for the Congress and the Atomic Energy Commission we would not have nuclear submarines. In 1948 when the Navy opposed nuclear submarines, the Navy's systems analysts made a study. This study showed that a nuclear submarine would be worth 1.41 times' as much as a conventional submarine; but would cost about twice as much. An Act making appropriations for public works for water and power development and energy research, including the Corps of Engineers-Civil, the Bureau of Reclamation, power agencies of the Department of the Interior, the Appalachian regional development programs, the Federal Power Commission, the Tennessee Valley Authority, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the Energy Research and Development Administration, and related independent agencies and commissions for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1977, and for other purposes. The federal budget process occurs in two stages: appropriations and authorizations. This bill was enacted after being signed by the President on July 12, 1976. Law. Pub.L. 94-355.
