Elementary School. A couple summers ago, Payton piloted a curriculum that taught the basics of Internet safety to kindergartners and first-graders. For two weeks that summer, 26 students showed up each day in their best surfing duds!Â The plan includes a simple activity using books from the school library and yarn to help students understand what the Internet is.
