The North Pennines was designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) in 1988 for its moorland scenery, the product of centuries of farming and leadmining. The route runs from Alston in Cumbria to Kirkhaugh in Northumberland via the South Tyne Viaduct, the Gilderdale Viaduct and the Whitley Viaduct. It lies in the Eden Valley, at the foot of the Cumbrian Pennines, a few miles north of Kirkby Stephen.
