Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel plans to roll out a task force on Monday to develop a strategy to deal with the problem of elder abuse. Kelly Rossman-McKinney is the attorney general's communications director. She says an estimated 73,000 older people in Michigan are victims of some type of elder abuse. She says that number is probably on the low side because the scope of the problem isn't known yet, and she says it takes many forms. "Physical abuse, financial exploitation, emotional abuse, neglect, or seniors who actually stop taking care of themselves," says Rossman-McKinney.
