This book says that it is an "advanced Guide", but please do not interpret this as a book not suitable for beginners. Troelsen presents his material in the fashion of a college level course, but a 101 type course. It goes into detail about why things are as they are, which for me at least, is very helpful in understanding what .Net and Visual Basic.Net are all about.
